Set on Chicago's South Side, Lorraine Hansberry's celebrated play concerns the divergent dreams and conflicts in three generations of the Younger family: son Walter Lee, his wife Ruth, his sister Beneatha, his son Travis, and matriarch Lena. When her deceased husband's insurance money comes through, Mama Lena dreams of moving to a new home and a better neighborhood in Chicago. Walter Lee, a chauffeur, has other plans: buying a liquor store and being his own man. Beneatha dreams of medical school. Hansberry's portrait of one family's struggle to retain dignity in a harsh and changing world is a searing and timeless document of hope and inspiration.

Directors Notes:

When I was asked if I would be interested in directing Lorraine Hansberry's play A Raisin in the Sun, I did not hesitate at the opportunity. This classic work is one of the greatest stage plays of the 20th Century. Some may ask, "Why A Raisin in the Sun now? Why a work written during a time of Jim Crow and 'Separate but Equal'? How can a work written for audiences in 1959 resonate with today's audiences? Why this play today?"

Well, I'll tell you why:

- Because it is such a well-written layered story with well-developed complex characters that deserves to be seen and shared.
 - Because there continues to be a need to expose communities to works fully written by, about, for, and near African Americans. Lorraine Hansberry is one of many "Shakespeare's" of our community! These stories matter!
 - Because racism and privilege continue to be an issue. Systemic racist practices continue in housing, education, healthcare, criminal justice, and other institutions and industries.
 - Because gaps and disparities in educational achievement, wealth, healthcare, criminal
 justice, leadership continue to be an issue -- the direct result of this country's legacy of
 slavery, segregation, and discrimination.
- Because this story lends itself to history. It contains historical truths in which the powers that be wish to silence and maintain control over by inciting fear through misinformation. on terminology such as "woke," "critical race theory," and anything that points to this country's history of discrimination and oppression.
- Because all families and individuals now and then wrestle with achieving certain dreams and visions they have for themselves and their families.
- Because the ability to persevere through obstacles and setbacks is a part of each of our journeys and experiences.
- Because love is central to survival, even when you think someone is undeserving of love.
 As Lena Younger says: "There is always something left to love. And if you ain't learned that, you ain't learned nothing."

I dedicate this production to the late, great Lorraine Hansberry, a champion for underrepresented communities, and all the ancestors who are now a part of that great cloud of witnesses.

Thank you for your sacrifices. Thank you for the blood, sweat, and tears you unselfishly gave to break so many glass ceilings, and often without recognition. And although we still have a long road ahead, thank you for being the arrowhead that has pierced the darkness, guiding us towards that marvelous Light.

In the quiet little village of Chipping Cleghorn, an announcement in the local newspaper causes a stir among the residents. There is to be a murder in the home of Miss Blacklock that evening! As Miss Blacklock, her lodgers, and curious visitors begin to arrive, tensions mount and everyone wonders if it's all a silly joke. However, the victim proves to be an unexpected visitor and not Miss Blacklock or one of the villagers at all. With the arrival of Inspector Craddock, a NNOUNCED murder investigation begins. Somewhat to his frustration, he is joined by amateur sleuth Miss Marple, who is always one step ahead. They reveal that Miss Blacklock is due to inherit a huge sum of money, but who would stand to gain from her murder? In a classic Agatha Christie tale of concealed identities, desperation, mixed motives, and another death, it takes a risky strategy to uncover the true identity of the murderer.
