As Miss Blacklock, her lodgers, and curious visitors begin to arrive, tensions mount and everyone wonders if it's all a silly joke. However, the victim proves to be an unexpected visitor and not Miss Blacklock or one of the villagers at all. With the arrival of Inspector Craddock, a murder investigation begins. Somewhat to his frustration, he is joined by amateur sleuth Miss Marple, who is always one step ahead. They reveal that Miss Blacklock is due to inherit a huge sum of money, but who would stand to gain from her murder? In a classic Agatha Christie tale of concealed identities, desperation, mixed motives, and another death, it takes a risky strategy to uncover the true identity of the murderer.

Directors Notes:

Director: Kay Burcher

I've always enjoyed reading mystery novels and Agatha Christie, known as the Queen of Crime, is one of my favorites. Therefore, I was excited to take over the task of directing this adaptation of her seventh-ranked most popular novel, A Murder Is Announced. However, when I started researching the novel/ play, I found it different from some of her earlier works. Although it has the usual "whodunnit" element, Christie started to strike a lighter note with this novel. She starts to move away from the cold-blooded and ingenious puzzles to mysteries centered more around the psychology of her characters. A Murder is Announced, written in 1950, is the book that started all that – She started writing more about the world around her ad the changing morals of the world after WW2, while still including the puzzles of her books from the 30's, the character novels of the 40's and the humor found in human nature in the 50's. Her focus on the foibles of humans in this novel added an element of humor that surprised me. I hope it surprises you, too.

One of the things that makes Christie's works so enjoyable is her use of plot twists/red herrings and of clues. Christie is a master at pointing us in the wrong direction—mistaken identities, accepting the innocence and goodness of a character - go a long way in setting us up for a surprise. And her cleverness at front-loading clues before we are aware of their significance is masterful. This adaptation is no exception. Be sure to pay careful attention to the scenes of mild domestic strife and/or bliss where Christie hides her plot twists and clues under the guise of normalcy. If you watch and listen carefully enough, you may be another "Miss Marple" and discover who the real killer is.

A big shout out to the cast and crew who worked tirelessly to bring this production to life, carefully crafting a show faithful to Agatha Christie's vision. Our hope is that it "keeps you on the edge of your seat".


